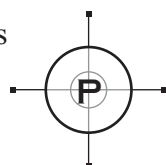
## bard

## boor

*Note:* Be careful not to confuse a *boor* (a rude person) with a *bore* (a boring person).



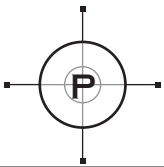

## bourgeois

(n.) a person who belongs to the middle class

*Brody considered himself a **bourgeois**, with middle class values and goals, even though his promotion qualified him for membership in the upper class.*

## Flash Card Components

**Part of Speech:** Identifying the part of speech is essential to understanding the word. This is especially true for words that serve as more than one part of speech, such as *dispute*. The word *dispute* can be a verb (“*he disputed the results*”) or a noun (“*I had a dispute with my teacher*”).

**Definition:** Each word is defined as it is most commonly used on the SAT. For example, the word *apt* is usually used to refer to likelihood (“*he was apt to get angry*”); however, on the SAT, the word *apt* most often refers to a person’s intelligence (“*he was an apt student*”). Therefore, the flash card definition reflects the common usage on the test.

**Sentence:** The word is used in a sentence to illustrate and clarify its meaning and usage. Some sentences use specific words and names as memory devices.

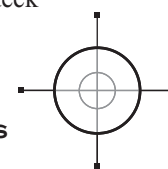

Some students learn best by hearing information rather than by seeing it.

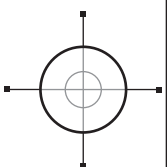

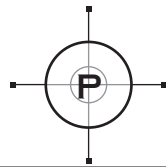

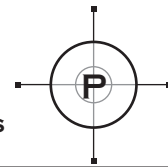

**Related Word:** utility



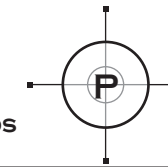

**Word Forms:** utopian (*adj.*), utopia, utopianism, utopianist



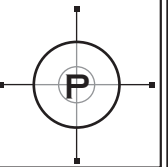

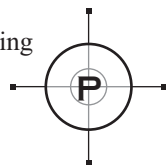

**Pronoun (*pr.*):** word that replaces a noun

**Verb (*vb.*):** word showing action or state of being

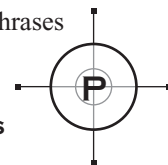
**Preposition (*prep.*):** word used to link a noun or pronoun to other words

**Adjective (*adj.*):** word which describes or modifies a noun or pronoun

**Adverb (*adv.*):** word which describes or modifies a verb, an adjective, or another adverb

**Conjunction (*conj.*):** word which links words or phrases

**Interjection (*int.*):** word used to convey emotion

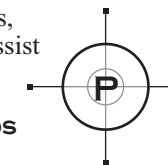
## Flash Card Components

**Word Forms:** The main entry on each card is either the base word or the most commonly used form of the word, but the SAT may use any of the forms of the word listed. For example, if *indignant* (*adj.*) is the main word on a card, you should also be prepared to see *indignantly* (*adv.*) or *indignation* (*n.*) on the test.

**Antonym Forms:** An antonym is a word with opposite meaning. You must understand the meaning of both the entry word on the card and its antonym, as the SAT expects you to apply the definition of the root word to many different forms of the word. For example, if *implausible* means *unbelievable*, then *plausible* must mean *believable*.

**Related Words:** Some words share common roots, prefixes, or suffixes. Related words are listed to assist you in remembering the definition of the word on the card.

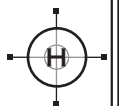

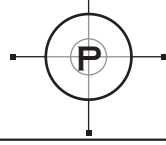

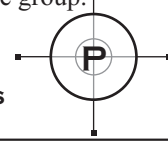
